

Porcelain & Ceramic Tiles

Porcelain and Ceramic tiles are hard wearing and require less maintenance than other surfaces. Most porcelain and ceramic tiles generally are not porous so there will be no benefit from sealing the tile. Sealing a non-porous tile will create a bigger problem as the sealer that can't be absorbed into the tile will then leave a residue and this will start to "grab" more dirt and grime quicker than before. The next thing to consider is that correct procedures and chemicals need to be used. Always dilute chemicals as per the label and allow dwell time to give the chemical time to break down dirt and grime.

Porcelain Types:



- **Polished Porcelain** - A polished finish is smooth with a high gloss/mirror like finish. The polishing process is achieved in the same way that natural stone is polished which is by abrasive pads to achieve the mirror like, high gloss polished look. Only some polished porcelain tiles may require sealing as due to the polishing process, tiny micro pores are created on the surface which can stain.
- **Honed Porcelain** - A honed finish is smooth with little or no gloss (flat or satin finish). This is achieved in a similar way to polished porcelain however the polishing process is stopped before a high gloss finish is achieved. This leaves the tiles with a matt/satin like finish.
- **Glazed Porcelain** - Porcelain tiles can have a matt or gloss decorative glaze applied to the surface. This hard wearing glaze finish allows for different looks to be achieved. This can be of marble, travertine or other type of natural stone, concrete, wood plank and even metallic or corrugated sheet metal finish. The possibilities are endless. Glazed porcelain tiles are the most popular type of porcelain tiles.
- **Un-Glazed Porcelain** - These are porcelain tiles that have no glaze applied and the colour runs right throughout the body of the tile (a single colour from the top surface to the base of the tile).

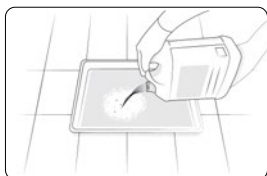
Porcelain & Grout Sealing Options

Grout is porous. Sealing the grout will provide stain resistance and allow for easier ongoing maintenance. This will provide a benefit to the overall appearance of the tiled surface.

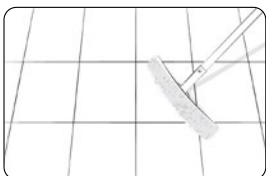

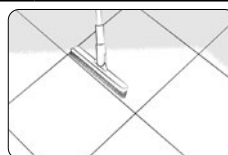
1. Dilute chemical as per label instructions



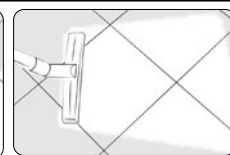
2. Apply solution to the floor and allow to dwell



3. After the dwell time scrub with white nylon pad, broom or brush



5. Scrub dirty grout joints with a grout brush



6. Remove dirty solution with a wet vac and rinse with clean water



Tiles and grout are now clean.

Note: Use a broom, bristle brush or white nylon pad to agitate dirty tiles. (Do NOT use a string mop). Always rinse thoroughly and leave the surface dry to prevent slip hazards.
